

### BEYOND THE “VICTIM” LABEL

#### UNDERSTANDING HOW TRAUMA IMPACTS INDIVIDUALS

Each year thousands of Floridians experience trauma as the result of crime, disasters, and other harmful events. Whether physical or emotional, trauma affects each person differently. To effectively respond to victims it is essential for volunteers and professionals to see the individual beyond the “victim” label. This inclusive program will benefit probation officers, first responders, victim advocates, social workers, mental health professionals, law enforcement, child protection advocates, educators, and all victim service professionals. During this 8-hour interactive training participants will gain a deeper understanding of the following:

- Diverse ways in which individuals and population groups are victimized;
- Signs, symptoms and lasting effects of trauma;
- Core needs of victimized individuals;
- Effective approaches for responses to victimized individuals.

She has done training locally and nationally in the area of sex offender treatment, batterer's intervention and trauma informed care. She is responsible for initiating trauma informed care into the Pinellas ex-offender Re-Entry Coalition and is a board member for Peace4tarpon working to maintain Tarpon as a trauma informed city.
