Mr. Harlin began his career in 1973 as a Patrolman for the City Beacon Police Department in New York. From 1976 to 1978 he served as Detective in Charge for the Juvenile/Community Relations Division responsible for the development, training, and oversight of the crime prevention and diversionary programs for troubled youth. By 1978 he began employment with the New York State Police and promoted to Senior Investigator by 1992. In 1995, Mr. Harlin was assigned as the Bureau of Criminal Investigation Coordinator. During his tenure he worked on traffic stops, criminal investigations, undercover narcotics operations and training development, implementation and instruction. Mr. Harlin has engaged in hundreds of lectures throughout the United States, Canada, and the Caribbean focusing on Interview and Interrogation, Courtroom Testimony and Demeanor, and Office Safety/Dealing with Problem Individuals. He is also an adjunct instructor for the International Association of Chief of Police. Mr. Harlin is a certified Master Instructor by the New York State Bureau of Municipal Police. He is a graduate of the New York State Police Academy, the Dale Carnegie course and the Municipal Police Training Counsel Academy Basic Course for Police Offices.
